What Works Are Protected?

Copyrightable works include the following:

- Books
- Magazines
- Journals
- Newsletters
- Maps
- Charts
- Photographs
- Graphic materials
- Electronic content
- Computer programs and other software
- Sound recordings
- Motion pictures
- Video files
- Sculptures and other artistic works
- Unpublished materials
- Other printed and non-printed materials

Find out if you need permission from the copyright holder before using the material(s) in your course. If you copy protected work without the necessary permission, the copyright owner may sue you and the College for copyright infringement.
